The European Student Card Initiative (ESCI)

Flagship initiative to make the European Education Area more inclusive, digital and interconnected.

- Facilitates digital exchanges among higher education institutions (HEIs), simplifies student mobility and builds a shared European identity for higher education students.
- All ECHE holders and HEIs participating in a European Universities alliance, commit to implementing the ESCI.
- The Council Recommendations on building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation (5 April 2022) and Europe on the Move – learning mobility opportunities for everyone (13 May 2024), call on Member States to support and widen ESCI implementation.

Statistics EWP

- Over 3.000 HEIs connected to EWP across 37 countries, not all exchanging IIAs and LAs
- 20 third-party providers
- 38 in-house systems
- EWP Dashboard EC funded solution, reference implementation
- Erasmus+ App- backend connected to the EWP Dashboard, HOME module




Steady growth in digital exchanges through EWP

Approximately 250.000 student mobilities for studies in Erasmus+ every year

- Academic year 22-23: estimated 37% of LAs signed digitally in EWP
- Academic year 23-24: estimated 53% of LAs signed digitally in EWP
- Projection of academic year 24-25: 67% of LAs signed digitally in EWP

Dark blue: Evolution of the percentage of DLA signed through the EWP Network

Light blue: For the ongoing academic year (projection – 2024-25), there will be around 89K manual LAs, representing 37% of the total mobilities - SMS.

The European Student Card (ESC)

The ESC adds a **European dimension to existing higher education student cards** so students can have their student status easily recognised across Europe.







- Simplify access to on- and offcampus services during mobility with their existing student card, just as local students (e.g., libraries, dormitories, discounts, etc.)
- Shared European student identity

- Securely validate the student card of incoming mobile students
- Support reciprocity in service provision to mobile students.
- Streamline the verification of student status
- Gain access to a wider network of users



ESC features

The ESC can be adapted to **digital** and **physical** formats **with any type of technology** (e.g., chip technology, magnetic stripe, etc).

HEIs can add these features to their existing cards via the ESC-Router.

European Student Card logo

Combines a European dimension (text & EU flag) with the QR code to facilitate its recognition across borders


ESCN - European Student Card Number

Unique card identifier of 16 bytes that links a specific card to the higher education institution that issued it

ESI - European Student Identifier

Unique identifier that allows to link a given student to a specific ESC. It is not printed on the card.

Outlook until end of the Erasmus+ programme





Guiding principles

- Consolidation and reinforcement of existing processes
- Investment to assure continuation of services and infrastructure until the end of the programming period
- Collaboration with EWP+ and NTT data consortia to assure continuity





European Student Card Goals until the end of the current Erasmus+ programme period



Accelerate issuance of ESCs within and across all programme countries



Completion of partnerships programme to bring added value to ESC holders



Launch of the ESC Service Catalogue



Roll out of the digital European Student Card



Erasmus Without Papers goals until the end of the current Erasmus+ programme

- Reach the 95% DLAs concluded in EWP network
- Introduction of nominations (beta testing) with a gradual roll out of nominations until the end of 2025
- Review ToR- modalities of deployment (2026 onwards)
- Prepare future IIA renewal scenarios (ongoing consultation)
- Acceptable use policy revision and implementation (2025)



Outlook for ESCI towards the new E+ programme

- Building on and safeguarding current investments in EWP
- Based on a thorough consultation of users and providers to establish future requirements
- Implementation based on EAC/EACEA cooperation
