About the Barcamp conference method:

Discussing, exchanging and developing ideas with like-minded people - this works perfectly at a barcamp. Barcamps - also known as 'open spaces' - are highly participative formats: A moderator explains the programme, the thematic input comes from the participants themselves.

At the beginning, participants present the issues they would like to discuss with others. Spontaneous session ideas are explicitly encouraged and just as welcome as mini-workshops or short impulses that participants bring with them. Presentations and long frontal lectures, on the other hand, are undesirable. The most popular topics will be identified and allocated to time slots and rooms. The ideas and topics brought along are discussed and worked on together in parallel sessions. The results are recorded on posters and shared with all other participants.

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
