Profile of participants:

This event aims to attract **newcomers to KA229**, School Exchange Partnerships, but experienced organizations who wish to expand their partner-base are also welcome to attend. The target group is post primary schools working with young people from the ages of 12-18 years. The Contact Making Seminar will have a strong Inclusion focus – we particularly welcome participants working with students of disadvantaged background or who have increased support needs.

Themes and goals of the event:

This is a Contact Making Seminar which will include some training elements and aims at attracting more organisations, particularly those with a strong Inclusion dimension in their schools, to engage in KA2 School Exchange Partnerships. It is targeted at both newcomer and experienced organisations who wish to develop their understanding of KA2; how to develop good quality proposals and who wish to find partners. The Contact Making Seminar will have a strong Inclusion focus – we particularly welcome participants working with students of disadvantaged background, or those with increased support needs.

Objectives of the event:

- Develop your understanding of KA229 projects
- Meet potential partners
- Develop your understanding of how to design good quality project proposals
- Strengthen the inclusion dimension of your proposal
- Share experience of international Schools projects





Expected results:

- hear first hand the opportunities under KA2 Schools Sector
- hear from past projects
- understand what makes a good quality project
- have the opportunity to meet potential future partners
- learn what steps are needed in applying
- address inclusiveness in projects

Cost:

Event fee: the hosting NA agency will cover the hosting costs.

Travel costs: SEPIE will contribute to the travel costs based on the table provided for TCAs. This financial support will be paid directly to the selected participant by SEPIE in compliance with the procedures established by this agency (see information on the SEPIE website).

Support for accommodation and meals not included in the activity programme: SEPIE will contribute to these costs based on the table provided for TCAs. This financial support will include accommodation during the seminar and up to 2 travel days and it will be paid directly to the selected participant by SEPIE in compliance with the procedures established by this agency (see information on the SEPIE website).

Support for participants with special needs: Applicants with special needs might apply for a reimbursement based on real costs. The reimbursement based on real costs will be granted only if it is clearly justified and requested in the application form, and once approved by the national agency (SEPIE). This financial support will be paid directly to the selected participant by SEPIE in compliance with the procedures established by this agency (see information on the SEPIE website). By choosing this option, the participant will renounce to a reimbursement based on unit costs.
